Moneve Dawn Frederick was born on August 19, 1948 to Dr. Sidney Frederick, DDS, originally of Arnaudville, LA, and Irene Savoie Frederick of Cankton, LA.

Dawn was one of the first attendees of the Laboratory Nursery School of USL, where her mother was the attending RN. She was one of the first students to attend the new school, Our Lady of Fatima. She graduated high school from The Academy of the Sacred Heart in Grand Coteau, LA, Class of 1966. She attended USL and subsequently joined Delta Delta Delta Sorority. She was chosen Queen of the Les Brigands de Lafite in the mid-1960's. Dawn loved her community of Lafayette, treasured its history, and was enriched by her many friends.

She is survived by her son and daughter-in-law, Todd and Heather Blount Rougeou and grandchildren, Emma Grace, Mattie Lynn and Will of Prairieville, LA; daughter, Heather Dawn Rougeou, of Lafayette; and sister and brother-in-law, Gay and Bill Rothe of Hilton Head Island, SC.
